Rules: From the entries at the Brussels Fair the judges will determine 1. **Grand Champion HAND-QUILTED Quilt** 2. **Grand Champion MACHINE-QUILTED Quilt.** All quilts entered may be any size but to qualify for an OAAS prize, the quilt **must be solely made and quilted by the exhibitor with a minimum perimeter of 324” (823 cm).** The size must be printed on the entry tag. These qualifying quilts will be judged at the District 8 level in October. Winners of that competition go on to the Provincial OAAS Quilt Competition in Toronto the following February.
