- 2024 Fair
 - Supplies for Section Leads ordered. M. Douma to pick up a tote box/bin and buy supplies for her section and submit receipts to G. Morrison for reimbursement. D. Cummings to pick up trophies in Listowel and submit the invoice to G. Morrison.
 - Kids program No report
 - Raffle Draw G. Morrison has tickets and members are encouraged to pick them up from her to sell and return the stubs and money to her when sold. R. Kellington provided handouts with detailed instructions, descriptions & pictures for sellers to follow. R. Kellington circulated a volunteer sign up sheet for selling Raffle and BBQ tickets at Foodland. More volunteers are still needed to sell tickets from 5-7pm on Fri. Aug. 30th, Sept. 6th and 13th. Email R. Kellington if you can help.

 - Pie Table We've always had enough or too many pies so again members are asked to make pies and recruit others from the community. No cream pies from the public. Drop off anytime Mon. night, Tues. or Wed. before noon
 - Vendor Market reviewed vendor market layout proposal with Pauline 13 spots down from last year (5 spots in new lobby & 8 in auditorium)
 - OAAS communicated TSSA regulations for inflatables Drew confirmed licensed with TSSA since 2016 & have all the required paperwork
 - Event information sent to Health Unit & link to Jeff/Terri/Zoey provided as food vendors
 - Ordered 1 hand washing station for 4-H show (\$90 + delivery fee)
 - BBQ and tickets J. Cardiff suggested serving Shaw's Ice Cream which takes a few strong volunteers to scoop. R. Kellington will ask J. Lowe to order enough white and chocolate milk for the BBQ and Wed. school lunch, and apples, cookies, etc. like in past years. G. Morrison has tickets and members are encouraged to pick them up from her to sell and return the stubs and money to her when sold. R. Kellington provided a handout with detailed instructions for sellers.

- Ad in Citizen for pie donation R. Vinnicombe will submit under Notices two weeks prior to fair and include that Terri Gray's inspected kitchen is available to make pies if members or the public bring their own supplies.
- Registration volunteer sign up is full.
- Canvas bushel inserts D. Cummings would like to purchase canvas for the Field Crop section to make small bushel inserts to prevent tearing of the bags and spilling grain and beans all over our display. She will be making them herself so just need to cover the cost of the canvas. A motion to give D. Cummings \$100 to pay for canvas for 50 bushel covers by L. Garland, was seconded by J. Bernard, motion carried.
- Meet Your Neighbour at the Library on Thursday Sept. 12th at 7pm. L. Garland reported that she is facilitating this meeting of newcomers and other interested members of the public and will talk about the Ag. Society. She would welcome other members to be there also.
- Fall Fair Book- R. Kellington reported that very few Fall Fair Books are still available to pick up at local businesses and the Library despite more demand. G. Morrison will make sure the 2024 FF Book is uploaded to our website via Z. Onn and J. Morrison. There was some discussion to simplify the FF Book in the future with less detail in some of the advertisements. It was suggested that a sub-committee be formed to assist Z. Onn with simplification.
- Day at the Races Fundraiser
 - Volunteer sign up 2 more volunteers are needed to help with the BBQ and 2 more to sell 50/50 tickets. R. Vinnicombe has confirmed prices and just needs to confirm quantities of supplies from Brussels Foodland. It was suggested that we use the experience of Foodland employees to help with quantities. Any leftovers could be sold at the food booth at the fair. G. Morrison to ask if we can borrow Leo's BBQ confirmed with Zoey that we can use the Leo's BBQ. Need to be ready to sell Food by 12:30pm

 - Draft was ready to submit for committee review but OAAS sent out a new template based on answers recently provided by OMAFRA.
